IPS009: a panel discussion on new challenges facing official statistics

- open data. Is it a threat or an opportunity? How should NSI's respond?
- when resources are scarce, should we focus on data collection, and let others do the analysis?
- how can NSI's best collaborate to reduce their costs?
- how can the official statistical community best support its members who have issues of statistical integrity with their governments?
- what should the boundaries of official statistics be?
- how do we draw a borderline between research and statistics or forecasting/now casting and statistics?
- should we produce data that are meant purely for administrative use such as the detailed chemical lists of plant protection products used and produced?
- how should we respond to those who would like us to measure something which actually is not measurable? e.g. what about the statistical measurement of non-observed economy?
